An extract from Salt of the Earth, Light of the World: A Spirituality of the Sunday Gospels, Year A by Peter Varengo, Morning Star Publications, Melbourne, 2014, pp.134-138.

While rituals are necessary human expressions of one's relationship with God, for Jesus faith demands that we push beyond the external signs and instead nourish the internal heart-relationship the externals represent... Faith must project the believer beyond observance, breaking down exclusions and limitations, and energise one into a relational faith where the external expressions lead to a personal and communal relationship with God and with each other. With absolute authority, Jesus stood up against this cart-before-the horse, juxtaposing ritual and relationship, even if a such a stance put him on an inevitable collision course with the authorities of his time. Jesus made it clear that he was not about changing a single dot of the Law, but about bringing that very Law to perfection, by abolishing limitations and giving the Law a universal embrace, upholding people's dignity, and setting them free to be what they are meant to be.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus is... trying to break away from the narrow and fearsome world by telling us that there is more to our dealings with God and with each other than simply keeping rules out of fear of punishment... For the person of faith, fidelity to God is not a private matter of playing by the rules for oneself, whether this be a personal spirituality, a regular religious practice or a jealously guarded me-and-God alone type of relationship. Faith is action and the person of faith is so open to others that he/she draws others into themselves not through fear but through honesty of action, respect for dignity and transparency of attitude. Consequently, where distance, boundaries, division or suspicion dominate relationships, the true Christian brings trust and truthfulness, supplanting guilt with joy, limitations with openness, and fear with affirmation and courage.

The only way that God's active presence becomes energy for hope, joy, courage and endurance in the real everyday world, is through the active lives of those who have the courage to go beyond prescriptions. Our call is to incarnate the very first page of the Creation story by seeing in every individual person around them the masterpiece of God's creative love and life. May we never be afraid of God's Word! May we be reckless enough to see through that Word and go beyond legal securities so as to discover the God in us beyond prescriptions!

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

Today we stand in footsteps millennia old. YOUNG ADULTS CIRCLE

Fr John joined the young adults evening to talk about God being in the centre of everything (not just the mass), that centres our own lives and who we are. NATIONAL CATHOLIC SAFEGUARDING STANDARDS

Over the next few months we will be providing further information on each of the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards which we introduced you to last year.

The 10 National Catholic Safeguarding Standards are taken directly from the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse's final report, Volume 6.

The Standards work together and ensure each entity, ministry and organisation across the Catholic Church place child safety at the core of how they plan, think and act.

STANDARD ONE: Committed leadership, governance and culture. Child safeguarding is embedded in the entity's leadership, governance and cultures.

- 1.1 The entity publicly commits to child safeguarding and takes a zero-tolerance approach to child abuse.
- 1.2 A child safeguarding culture is championed and modelled at all levels of the entity from the top down and bottom up.
- 1.3 Governance arrangements facilitate implementation of a Child Safeguarding Policy across the entity's activities.
- 1.4 A Code of Conduct provides guidelines for personnel on expected behavioural standards and responsibilities.
- 1.5 The entity has risk management strategies focusing on preventing, identifying and mitigating risks to children.
- 1.6 Personnel understand their obligations on information sharing and record keeping.
