A Reflection on the Gospel based on an extract from: An extract from *Salt of the Earth, Light of the World, a Spirituality of the Sunday Gospels, Year A* by Peter Varengo, pp. 131-134

Salt and Light of the World

In today's Gospel, the disciple becomes identified with salt and light, an identification which reveals both our identity and our mission as followers.

... From the dawn of history people recognised [salt's] health-giving powers, and in our ordinary dealings, salt brings out the flavour of food, making our table gatherings tasty and enjoyable. It preserves the goodness and adds to the richness of other elements... That is what Jesus is driving at in addressing us as salt. Hidden in our ordinary, unassuming, and even unrecognised selves, God sees preciousness, richness and great potential. We may not think much of ourselves, feeling helpless in our needs and incapable of reaching out to others, but God still thinks us precious, a valuable and necessary commodity for his mission of healing, peace-making and life-giving. God needs us to achieve his plans precisely through our weakness, helplessness and the ordinary unpretentious routine of daily life. That is our identity in God's eyes and dream.

But like most things human, salt can become tasteless through abandonment or lack of use... then its potential is lost... we may resent being qualified as useless but that is just what Jesus calls us when we stifle the potential which God has gifted each of us... The Christian is the one who affects and infects others with joy, hope, healing and a taste for life, just like Jesus' life did...

Like the light that breaks the darkness of mind and brings warmth to cold hearts by giving of itself exhaustingly to that last tired flicker of final energy, so the Christian has no option but to bring forth energy and light and warmth wherever one's story unfolds, letting these gifts well up from inside oneself. The Christian is someone who lets God in, so that through you and me, God will explode out to the whole world... Every single gesture of human promotion and of authentic acceptance and love becomes a clear sign that it is possible to be light and hope around us where we are, just as Jesus calls us to be.

God overwhelms us with his gifts, filling us beyond our understanding and our means. But those gifts become real for the world and authentic self-expressions for all of us, when we allow that God-empowered light to break through the fragility of our lives and become a beacon of joy and hope in the midst of the darkness that often envelops this world and the experience of those around us.

Common salt and flickering light - that is our identity and our mission! ... The disciple cannot be otherwise, because God names us by those very elements of life and wants us to be energy of salt and light to the world.

Our Parish supports the recommendations of the Royal Commission and all endeavours to bring healing to and justice for the victims of abuse. Our Parish Leadership & Development Team and Safeguarding Committee work proactively to ensure the safety of all children, young people and vulnerable adults in our community

Today we stand in footsteps millennia old. May we acknowledge the Elders, families and forebears of the Boonwurrung and Wurundjeri tribes of the Kulin Nations, who are the traditional custodians of our parish land, whose cultures and customs have nurtured, and continue to nurture, this land since men and women awoke from the great dream. We honour the presence of these ancestors who reside in the imagination of this land and whose irrepressible spirituality flow through all creation.

NATIONAL CATHOLIC SAFEGUARDING STANDARDS

Over the next few months we will be providing further information on each of the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards which we introduced you to last year.

The 10 National Catholic Safeguarding Standards are taken directly from the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse's final report, Volume 6.

The Standards work together and ensure each entity, ministry and organisation across the Catholic Church place child safety at the core of how they plan, think and act.

We'll start with STANDARD ONE next week but we were informed of some free webinars which relate to STANDARD EIGHT so will leapfrog to that first.

STANDARD EIGHT: Safe physical and online environments

Physical and online environments promote safety and contain appropriate safeguards to minimise the opportunity for children to be harmed.

The eSafety Commissioner is presenting two free webinars in the month of February for parents and carers of young people.

1. Helping kids thrive online - which is suitable for parents and carers of young people aged 5-12 years old.
2. Tech, teens and time online - which is suitable for parents and carers of young people aged 12-18 years old.

FAITH AND ENVIRONMENT

This summer Australia is experiencing unprecedented bushfire season resulting in tragic loss of human life, homes and livelihoods. There has also been a massive impact on biodiversity with the death of over 1 billion animals and destruction and over 17 million hectares burnt including mature forests many of which will take over 100 years to recover. There will also be loss of species to extinction from this ongoing crisis which is linked to having the hottest, driest weather on record in 2019.

Bishop Vincent Long has said in response:

The bushfire crisis should serve as a wake-up call to Australia and act as a catalyst for global action on climate change. In the light of the ecological crisis we must have the courage to align ourselves with God's plan for the world. Only by acting in the best interests of the environment, of the poor and of future generations can we save this planet from destruction.
